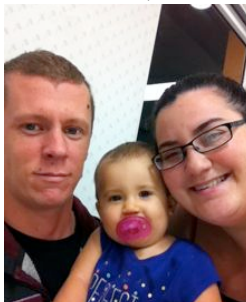

Recipe of the Month: Molten Chocolate Cakes

Most of you have figured out by now that I definitely have a sweet tooth, and for me the ultimate sweet is CHOCOLATE! These are easy and yumilicious, the perfect Valentines Day dessert. I like to serve them with fresh raspberries and vanilla ice cream for the ultimate decadent pleasure! They are almost foolproof, and the batter can be made several hours in advance. Fill the cups and refrigerate, just remember to bring to room temperature before you bake them.

Ingredients:

- 1 cup unsalted butter
- 8 oz semisweet or bittersweet chocolate, cut into small chunks (I have even used chocolate chips in a pinch)
- 5 large eggs
- ½ cup sugar
- pinch of salt
- 4 tsp flour

Melt butter and chocolate in a medium heatproof bowl over a saucepan of simmering water; remove from heat.

Beat eggs, sugar and salt with a hand mixer in a medium bowl until sugar dissolves. Beat egg mixture into chocolate until smooth. Beat in flour until just combined.

(Batter can be made a day ahead; return to room temperature an hour or so before baking.)

Before serving dinner, adjust oven rack to middle position; heat oven to 450 degrees. Brush 6 1-cup capacity soufflé cups or coffee cups with melted butter, and dust with granulated sugar to prevent sticking. Divide batter among the cups.

Place on a sheet pan and bake for 9-12 minutes, watching closely. The sides should be set but the center still dipped and slightly underdone.

Remove from the oven and let sit for 3-5 minutes, then immediately remove by placing a serving dish over each one and flipping over quickly and carefully. Serve with raspberries and ice cream.

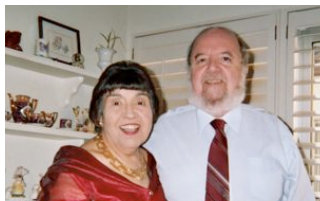

Jessica Babel makes us smile because she likes her pancakes with a happy face on top ☺

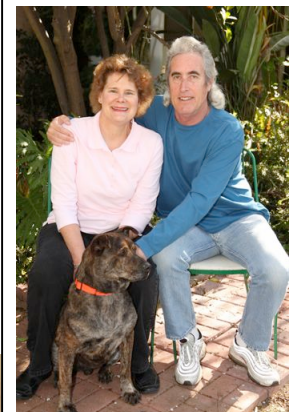

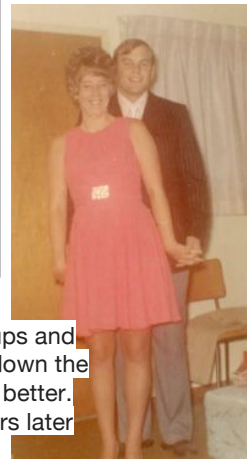
Rod and Joanie
